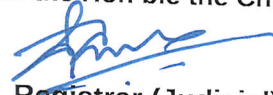
I.	All the matters would be listed before the Honourable Courts as per roster.
II.	The Cause list of fresh and adjourned matters would be circulated two days in advance. However, those cases wherein listed matters are ordered to be placed on the next day or mentioning is accepted for the next day, a supplementary cause list would be published a day before.
III.	The matters, in which Office Objections are not removed within time limit, shall be listed before the Hon'ble Court as per roster, as prescribed under the Gujarat High Court Rules, 1993.
IV.	The matters (i) for restoration and (ii) matters of Condonation of delay filed in restoration matters, where the main stamp (filing) numbered matter had been disposed of by the Honourable Court as dismissed for default for non removal of office objections, shall be placed before the Hon'ble Court as per roster.
V.	All filing number (Stamp) matters of Auto Listing i.e. (1)Regular Bail (Criminal Misc. Applications and Criminal Appeals under The Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989); (2) Anticipatory Bail (Criminal Misc. Applications and Criminal Appeals under The Scheduled Castes and the Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989) and (3)Quashing Petitions (Criminal Misc. Applications u/s. 482 of CrPC and Special Criminal Applications u/s. 226/227 of the Constitution r/w sec.482 of CrPC) having office objections will be listed before the Registrar (Judicial) for passing appropriate order.
VI.	The priority will be given to old matters and the Matters pertaining to Senior Citizens, withdrawal of medical treatment, women, children, persons with disabilities, HIV infected persons, Intellectual Property Rights cases, Confirmation cases and Ten Years Old Cases of all the categories will be placed as per the Roster giving priority. Pending cases under Sections 304B, 498A and 304B r/w 498A IPC shall not, ordinarily, be adjourned.
VII.	Matters pertaining to Election (Original side) under the Representation of People Act, 1951 will be placed before Honourable Judge to whom matter is assigned by Honourable the Chief Justice and will be treated as assigned till final disposal.
VIII.	Leave Note will not apply to Criminal Cases, Special Civil Applications and matters specially fixed for hearing or expedited by the order of the Court and matters on the Daily Board.
IX.	The Matters wherein Apex Court had passed order for expeditious hearing/time bound hearing including Criminal Cases against sitting as well as former Legislators-MPs and MLAs (excluding Criminal Appeals) be given priority by the concerned Honourable Courts and those matters would be listed before the bench to whom matters assigned by Honourable the Chief Justice.

X.	The Jail Applications of the Prisoners in pending Criminal Appeals, Criminal Revision Applications before the Hon'ble High Court will be placed before the Hon'ble Court taking Criminal Appeals, Criminal Revision Applications as per Roster.
XI.	Top priority will be given to old criminal Appeals/Petitions of Final Hearing cases in which the accused are in custody including Appeals wherein Bail is rejected and unnecessary adjournment shall not be granted.
XII.	Priority will be given where the proceedings before the Trial Courts have been stayed and in which the injunction or stay order has been passed by the High Court.
XIII.	The Matters arising out of the Same Judgment/Order will be listed with the main cognate matter.
XIV.	Sufficient ready matters will be listed by the Board Department with the co-operation of Judicial Branches for Admission, Final Hearing and orders as per the directions of the Hon'ble the Chief Justice and Hon'ble Courts, as per roster, in the interest of justice, so that the time should be utilized resourcefully to meet with the challenges for the High Court.
XV.	The List of Sittings and the Boards of Hon'ble Courts for Admission, Final Hearing and the Notices regarding Special Benches and non-availability of the Hon'ble Judges, status / Judgments / orders of the matters will be displayed on the Web Site of " http://gujarathighcourt.nic.in " for information.
XVI.	Members of the Bar are hereby informed that Applications for bail or Anticipatory Bail shall ordinarily not be adjourned by the respective benches. They are requested to co-operate in ensuring the early disposal of such matter, preferably within two (2) months from the date of filing.
XVII.	The Learned Public Prosecutor to assist the Special Division Benches sitting on Friday for speedy disposal of old Criminal Acquittal Appeals, the Learned Public Prosecutor is required to be distribute the cases on the board equally amongst Learned APP in advance so that they may be ready with the matter by the date fixed so as to avoid any adjournment.
XVIII.	The list of Specially assigned matter to the Special Division Benches constituted for sitting on Friday (Post Lunch) will be circulated in advance to the office of the Public Prosecutor.
